1. Purva

This is the earliest or first level of learning that happens in a practical mode. This gives the first - hand experience of the stream.

Joining criteria

- ✓ Minimum of 6 years of age in order to comprehend the teaching
- ✓ Able to read Tamil/English

2. Prathama

This is the second level of learning to move into singing/playing of geethams. This gives the first -hand experience of how the swaras and lyrics are connected in songs.

Joining criteria

- ✓ Minimum of 7 years of age
- ✓ Certified as "Purva"
- ✓ Able to read Tamil/English

3. Avantara

This is the third level of learning to move into singing/playing of geethams, varnams and basic krithis. This gives the first -hand experience of raga aspects/lakshanams, composers/vaageyakkaras, tala dimensions and musical terms.

Joining criteria

- ✓ Minimum of 9 years of age
- ✓ Certified as "Prathama"
- ✓ Able to read Tamil/English

4. Uttara

This is the fourth level of learning to move into singing/playing of geethams, varnams and krithis at the next level of complexity. This gives the first -hand experience of being able to write notations, tune instruments etc.

Joining criteria

- ✓ Minimum of 11 years of age
- ✓ Certified as "Avantara"
- ✓ Able to read Tamil/English

- ✓ Able to read Tamil/English
